The Holy Father will bless the palm and olive branches and, at the end of the procession, will preside over the Eucharistic celebration.

**Saint Peter's Basilica, 9.30**

The Holy Father will preside over the concelebration of the Chrism Mass with the Patriarchs, Cardinals, Archbishops, Bishops and Priests (diocesan and religious) present in Rome.

**GOOD FRIDAY «PASSION OF THE LORD»****Celebration of the Passion of the Lord**

**Saint Peter's Basilica, 17.00**

The Holy Father will preside over the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Holy Cross and the Holy Communion.

**Via Crucis****Colosseum, 21.15**

The Holy Father will preside over the pious exercise of the "Via Crucis", at the end of which he will address the faithful and impart the Apostolic Blessing.

**16-17 April 2022****EASTER SUNDAY «RESURRECTION OF THE LORD»****Easter Vigil of the Holy Night**

**Saint Peter's Basilica, 19.30**

The Holy Father will bless the new flame in the atrium of Saint Peter's Basilica; after the processional entry into the Basilica with the Paschal candle and the singing of the *Exsultet*, he will preside over the Liturgy of the Word, the Baptismal Liturgy and the Eucharistic Liturgy, which will be concelebrated with the Patriarchs, the Cardinals, the Bishops who wish to and some Priests, subject to availability of places.

**Mass of the day**

The Holy Father will preside over the Eucharistic Celebration. At the end of the celebration, at 12.00, he will impart the "Urbi et Orbi" Blessing from the central loggia of the Basilica.
